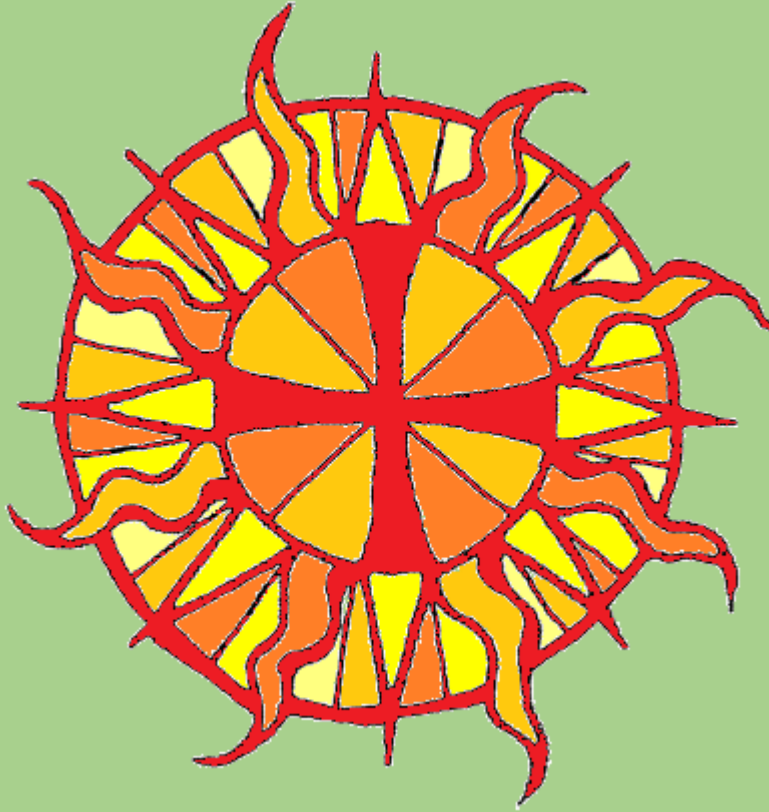

Hymn numbers are found in *The Hymnal 1982* (blue book).

G&P numbers are found in *Glory & Praise* (green book).

Please participate in our service today as fully as you feel comfortable doing so. We encourage you to join with us in singing the hymns and songs. Any of the texts in **bold print** are intended to be responses from the entire congregation, so we invite you to add your voice to everyone else's at those points. In the Episcopal Church we often stand, sit, kneel, or use gestures (bowing, making the sign of the cross, etc.) in our prayers; please feel free to do what feels comfortable to you. If you need help finding where we are in the service, please ask someone nearby if they can help you, or ask the Usher.

Today is our Annual Meeting – a day when we take a look at our activities in the past year and conduct a bit of necessary business (voting for officers, previewing the budget, etc.). The Annual Meeting is also an exciting time to prepare ourselves mentally and spiritually for the work that lies ahead of us in the year we are beginning.

The words of our worship come from *The Book of Common Prayer*, which is our primary document for worship in The Episcopal Church. We also use some texts from *Enriching Our Worship*, which is an additional resource of the Episcopal Church that expands the language and images we use for God, for humanity, and for all of creation.

We are a “Prayer Book” people in the Episcopal Church. Our use of this booklet isn't an effort to take us away from the *Book of Common Prayer*, but to make it easier to navigate the order of worship. In fact, we encourage you to explore the depth of riches to be found in *The Book of Common Prayer*!

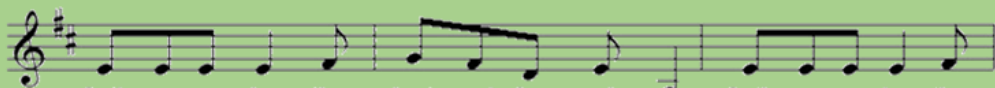

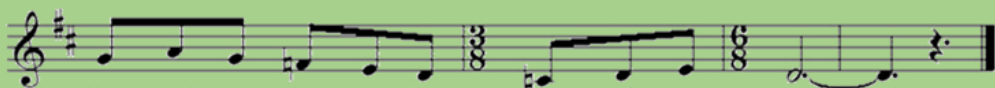

A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah

Isaiah 58:1-12

Shout out, do not hold back!

your vindicator shall go before you,
the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard.
Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer;
you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am.
If you remove the yoke from among you,
the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil,
if you offer your food to the hungry
and satisfy the needs of the afflicted,
then your light shall rise in the darkness
and your gloom be like the noonday.

The LORD will guide you continually,
and satisfy your needs in parched places,
and make your bones strong;
and you shall be like a watered garden,
like a spring of water,
whose waters never fail.
Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt;
you shall raise up the foundations of many generations;
you shall be called the repairer of the breach,
the restorer of streets to live in.

A Reading from First Corinthians

1 Corinthians 2:1-12

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written,

“What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,
nor the human heart conceived,
what God has prepared for those who love him” —

these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God.

For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.”

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you.

**In him, you have brought us out of error into truth,
out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.**

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said,

**“Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.”**

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said,

**“Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”**

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,
We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,
We await his coming in glory.

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all;
presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray
you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may
be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant.
Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice,
that we may be acceptable through him,
being sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, bring all things into the care of your Christ, and
bring us to that heavenly country where, with _____ and all your saints,
we may enter the everlasting heritage of all your children; through Jesus

now and for ever. AMEN.

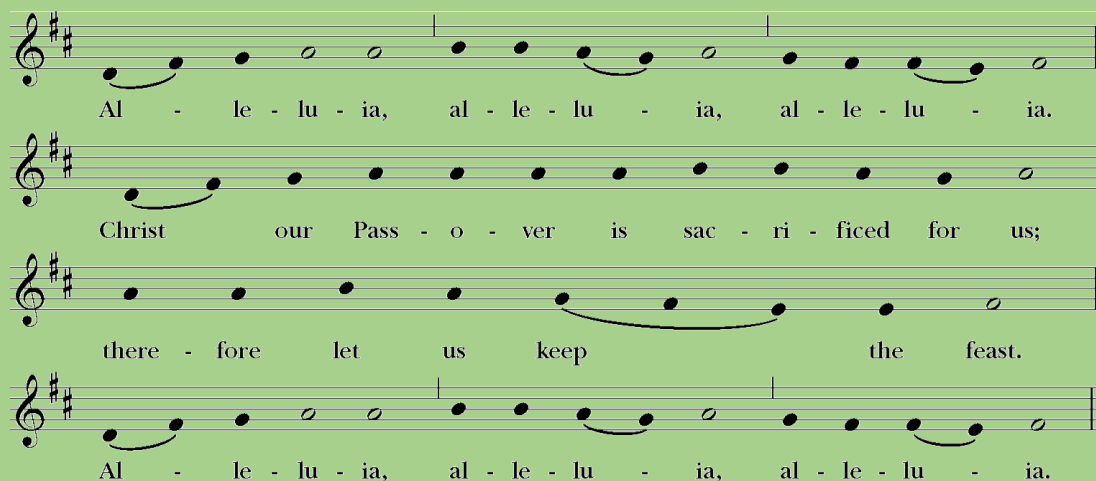
The Lord's Prayer

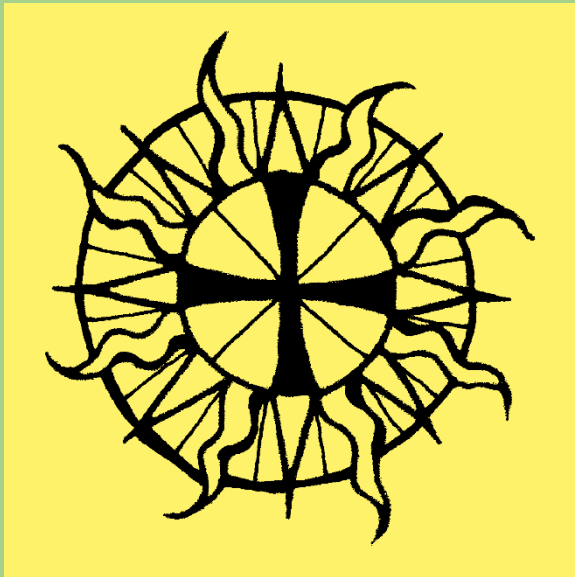
